To help farm/ranch families start their succession planning process, **NDSU Extension** has developed an interactive program, *Design Your Succession Plan*. This program will provide tools and resources for producers who want to begin the succession planning process. The program will explore the four components of succession planning: planning your business, retirement, transition and estate. You will be prepared to communicate, write, plan, vision and shape the legacy of the family farm/ranch business as well as save hundreds of dollars by completing these crucial planning steps *before* visiting with professionals.

This virtual workshop will combine three live, online meetings with weekly emails containing resources, videos, and homework assignments.

# FAT TUESDAY

National Day Calendar

The last day of Carnival and the day before for Ash Wednesday, Fat Tuesday is the intertwining of a period of festivals and feasts that lead to a time of fasting and reflection. Also known as Shrove Tuesday and Mardi Gras, this enduring celebration has many traditions and deep roots around the world.

Mardi Gras (French for Fat Tuesday) dates back to an ancient Roman festival honoring the deities *Lupercalia* and *Saturnalia* which took place in mid-February. When Christians arrived in Rome, they incorporated the festival into Lenten preparations.

For centuries, this solemn feast prepared Christians for the season of Lent and used up valuable meat and supplies they would be abstaining from in the days to come. Traditions surrounding the day have changed through the ages. Through time and culture, the practices of Lent and Carnival, Mardi Gras, and Shrove Tuesday have varied and become incorporated into regional customs.

In the United Kingdom, Shrove Tuesday is also known as Pancake Day. Pancakes are the perfect menu item when the future includes abstaining from fats, eggs, and sweets! In Russia, they celebrate the entire week during Shrovetide as Pancake Week.

## Carnival & Mardi Gras

While the French didn't originate the medieval feast, they did put their stamp on it. From parades to *beignets* and colorful masks, the last day of Carnival is full of elaborate costumes and lavish food sure to hold the revelers over through a long fast. During the 16th century, their ancestors celebrated *Boeuf Gras* (fatted calf) which included a tradition of parading a bull decorated with flowers through the city. The decorated animal is followed through the streets by a retinue of colorfully dressed attendants and bands playing unusual instruments. There was even a Boeuf Gras Society in Mobile, Alabama at one time. (See history below for more information.)

New Orleans holds the crown for Carnival and Mardi Gras celebrations in the United States. While the city is filled with French flavor and style, its culture is an eclectic infusion of many cultures. Colorful King Cake and thick, savory muffuletta sandwiches only suggest the indulgence possible on Fat Tuesday. Regional specialties like Etouffee, Po'boys, and jambalaya all add to the atmosphere of the day.

And while we satisfy our cravings, let's not forget our beverages. Signature creations from New Orleans hit the spot. Be sure to try the Sazerac made with absinthe or the citrus cocktail Arnaud's Special. For a smooth drink with some punch mix up a Vieux Carré made with whiskey, cognac, and sweet vermouth. But you don't have to have a cocktail to enjoy the feast! Fat Tuesday has plenty of beverages full of refreshing flavor. Coffees, sodas, and shakes of every flavor can be found.

## HISTORY

The roots of the celebration have been woven together for centuries from medieval spring festivals and feasts that were based on the Christian calendar. Fat Tuesday is celebrated around the world in its various forms all of which harken back to these roots of spring festivals and religious fasting in preparation for the Holy day of Easter.

Credit for bringing Mardi Gras to America goes to French explorers Pierre Le Moyne Sieur d'Iberville and Jean Baptiste Le Moyne Sieur de Bienville. In 1699, d'Iberville reached the mouth of the river on Shrove Tuesday near what is now Louisiana and named it Pointe du Mardi Gras.

Thanks to their establishment of Fort Louis de la Mobile, modern-day Mobile, Alabama lays claim to the first Mardi Gras celebration on American soil in 1703.

When de Bienville established Nouvelle Orleans in 1788, Mardi Gras celebrations reportedly began immediately. In 1875, Louisiana declared Fat Tuesday an official holiday.

# Angel Food Lush

## INGREDIENTS

14 oz. Angel Food Cake (made or bought)  
1 strawberry coulis (syrup)-*see recipe*  
8 oz. cream cheese  
1 c. confectioner's sugar

1/3 c. milk  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
8 oz. Cool Whip  
½ lbs. strawberries (sliced)

### Coulis (syrup)

1 lb. strawberries (16 oz.)  
¼ c. sugar  
1 tbsp. lemon zest  
1 tbsp. lemon juice

## DIRECTIONS

Bake angel food cake or buy already made. Cut into bite sized pieces with serrated knife or tear apart. Blend softened brick of cream cheese with confectioner's sugar & milk. Add 8 oz. of Cool Whip & vanilla extract. Mix until smooth again. Put cake pieces in a 9x13 or 2 -2.5 quart, baking dish. Spread cream cheese mix over cake cubes. Then spread remaining Cool Whip over top.

Coulis layer: Wash, hull & either slice or chop strawberries. Add berries, sugar, lemon juice & lemon zest (I use lime juice) to saucepan. Bring to a low boil stirring occasionally. Reduce heat & simmer on low for 5 minutes. Remove pan & let cool. Transfer cooled mixture to blender or food processor & blend until smooth. Pour & spread over cake mixture. Sprinkle on extra strawberries if desired. Refrigerate for at least 30 minutes.

## Turning Mistakes into Opportunities

“Gosh, darn it.” (OK, I may have used some other choice words.)

In a span of what seemed like three minutes, my kitchen went from freshly swept, mopped and cleaned (which if I am being honest, doesn't happen nearly enough) to a food disaster zone.

My 18-month-old-daughter had taken all the food out of our panty, probably letting me know that she was hungry and needed a snack.

Decision time. Do I yell and let her know how disappointed and upset I am? Or do I take a deep breath (or 15 deep breaths) and let my daughter know that we are going to work on cleaning up the mess together.

I'll leave the end of the story up to your imagination.

Handling of mistakes is one of those things that gets passed down through generations unless you make a conscious effort to try something new. If your parents were uncomfortable with mistakes or hid mistakes, then it is likely that you may feel the same way- because you never learned how to deal with those experiences.

One of the biggest gifts we can give our children as parents is to be a healthy model of how to handle our own mistakes and other's mistakes.

We turn these moments of mistakes from shameful experiences into opportunities for to learning to solve problems.

How do we do this?

My first suggestion for parents is to make mistakes on purpose and let your kids see them. Spill the water on the floor, forget your keys in the house, drop the folded basket of laundry (OK, this may be taking it a little too far in my life after I just spent all that time folding the laundry!). When we make mistakes on purpose, we are often in a good state of mind to show them how we can recover from that mistake.

Suggestion number two: calmly repeat the phrase. “How can we solve this problem?” when anyone makes mistakes. For example, your kids forget their shoes in the house (How can they always forget their shoes in the house?). Instead of letting them know that you are beyond annoyed that they keep forgetting their shoes and they need to do a better job and be more responsible and they are the reason that you are late for everything, you can simply ask, “How can you solve this problem?”

Your child spills their drink all over your new tablecloth. “How can you solve this problem?” “Do you need my help solving this problem?”

They forget to do their homework. “How can you solve this problem? I can let you know how I would handle it.”

Your child wets the bed. Again. “Mistakes happen. What could you do so this doesn't happen tomorrow?”

Suggestion number three is an exercise I just learned attending a seminar on mistakes. Yes, there are seminars offered on how to make mistakes. Who knew?

The exercise is this: write down on a piece of paper a mistake you made recently, what you learned about yourself making this mistake and a small step you can do to recover from this mistake.

Then you share this mistake with someone (friend, spouse, significant other, your child, etc.). When you do this exercise, start with saying your mistake, then you say your mistake again and what you learned about yourself, and finally say mistake again, what you learned about yourself and a small step you can do to recover from this mistake.

Here was my example at the conference: I recently was very upset with my older daughter about her asking me to do her hair for what seemed like the 98<sup>th</sup> time. I learned that my words can be really damaging. A small step I could take to recover is that I need to be clearer about when I am available to do hair in the morning. What I learned from this experience is that saying our mistakes and sharing them with a group of people is incredibly humbling and also healing.

We became more comfortable realizing that everybody makes mistakes.

You can choose to hide those mistakes or use them as an opportunity for your kids to know that they have the control to solve problems, and they can ask for your help with problems that come up in their life.

So, dear parents, let your kids see you make those mistakes, but most importantly let your kids know that mistakes are recoverable.





# NORTH DAKOTA GAME & FISH



## **Electronic Posting System for Private Land Available**

Landowners [interested in posting private land electronically](#) for the 2022-23 hunting season can [log into My Account](#) on the North Dakota Game and Fish Department website, [gf.nd.gov](http://gf.nd.gov). The deadline for landowners to digitally post land is July 1, which is necessary to produce print material and digital content prior to hunting seasons that begin in August.

The 2021 state legislature passed a bill to allow electronic posting of private land, giving landowners another option for posting private property.

Landowners who enrolled land electronically last year can renew, add or modify posting designations during the enrollment period. Others posting for the first time might need to create a profile. To post land, proceed to the "Land Parcels/Electronic Posting" section at the bottom of the page and click "Search/Renew Land parcels." The electronic posting system is linked to land descriptions based on county tax parcel information.

The Game and Fish website has [complete instructions for landowners](#), along with frequently asked questions for both landowners and hunters.

## **Game and Fish Violations Tallied**

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department's enforcement division tallied the number of hunting, angling and boating citations for 2021, and failure to carry a license was the number one violation.

Game wardens issued more than 2,600 citations last year. Counties with the most violations were Ramsey (399), Williams (132) and Benson (125).

The most common violations and number issued were:

- Boating (846): inadequate number of personal flotation devices (247); failure to display boat registration (92); and use of unlicensed/unnumbered boat (63).
- Licensing (493): failure to carry license (256) and hunting/fishing/trapping without proper license (213).
- Fishing (406): aquatic nuisance species violations (137) and exceeding limit (81).
- Small game (243): using shotgun capable of holding more than three shells (70) and failure to leave identification of game (62).
- General (209): hunting on posted land without permission (58); use of motor vehicle off established trail (55); and loaded firearm in vehicle (48).
- Miscellaneous (182): criminal trespass (71); minor in possession (30); and possession of a controlled substance (30).
- Big game (170): CWD violations (20); tagging violations (18); and failure to wear fluorescent orange (17).
- Wildlife management areas/refuge (82): Failure to obey posted regulations (50).
- Furbearer (18): Shining (using artificial light) (7).

While wardens issued more than 2,600 citations in 2021, that number hardly compares to the number of people contacted by wardens and no citations were issued. These license checks, boating safety inspections, public safety calls, wildlife issues, the list goes on, are as important as the number of citations issued.

In total, game wardens made 51,100 field contacts in 2021. This number does not include public contacts at sport shows, state fair, local wildlife club meetings, school programs, hunter safety classes, and other community events.

## **Guide and Outfitter Exam Scheduled**

The next guide and outfitter written examination is April 2 at 1 p.m. at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department office in Bismarck. Preregistration is required no later than March 25 by calling the department's enforcement office at 701-328-6604.

In addition to passing a written exam, qualifications for becoming a guide include a background check for criminal and game and fish violations, certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and standard first aid, and employment by or contract with a licensed hunting outfitter.

Hunting outfitter eligibility requirements include the guide qualifications, and an individual must have held a hunting guide license for two years and must have proof of liability insurance.



# PRESIDENTS DAY

National Day Calendar

On the third Monday in February, the United States celebrates the federal holiday known as Presidents Day. The day takes place during the birth month of the country's two most prominent presidents, George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. While the day once only honored President George Washington on his birthday, February 22nd, the day now never lands on a single president's birthday. Across the country, most Americans know the day as Presidents Day. More and more of the population celebrates the day to honor all of the past United States Presidents who have served the country. Throughout the country, organizations and communities celebrate the day with public ceremonies.

The origin of Presidents Day lay in the 1880s when the birthday of George Washington was celebrated as a federal holiday. In 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Bill. The bill moved several federal holidays to Mondays creating three-day weekends. During the debate on the bill, one proposal suggested George Washington's birthday be renamed Presidents Day to honor the birthdays of both George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Washington's birthday is February 22nd and Lincoln's birthday is February 12th. Although Abraham Lincoln's birthday was celebrated in many states, it was never an official federal holiday. Following much discussion, Congress rejected the name change.

Despite the rejection, soon after the bill went into effect in 1971, and the observance of Washington's birthday shifted to the third Monday in February, gradually Presidents Day became the commonly accepted name. Over time, the observance came to be known to many as a day to honor both Washington and Lincoln. However, today another shift has occurred, and many see the day as a celebration of all the U.S. Presidents.

## Presidents FAQ

Q. How often are U.S. presidential elections held?

A. Every four years. The next presidential election will be held in 2024.

Q. When do U.S. presidents take the oath of office?

A. The 20th Amendment of the United States Constitution states that the term of each U.S. President begins at noon on January 20th following the election. The oath of office is taken during the inauguration on that day.

Q. When did George Washington take his oath of office?

A. The United State's first president, George Washington, took his oath of office on April 30, 1789, at the federal hall in New York City.
