Easter Bunny Snack Board

The Baker Mama



INGREDIENTS

- 1 (16 oz.) container plain humus
- 1 (6 oz.) can large black olives, drained
- 2 cherry tomatoes
- 20-25 asparagus spears
- 40 round pita crackers
- 1 red bell pepper, sliced
- 1 (12 oz.) bag broccoli
- 9 celery stalks, each cut into thirds
- 6 radishes, sliced thinly
- 10-12 petite whole carrots
- 1 (12 oz.) bag cauliflower

INSTRUCTIONS

Using a 20"x13" rimmed board, platter or sheet pan, place a 8.5" rimmed round plate in the center of the board. Fill the plate with the hummus. Decorate the bunny's hummus face with two olives for the eyes, a cherry tomato for the nose, olive fourths to create the mouth shape, and asparagus spears for the whiskers. Arrange half the pita crackers for one of the bunny's ears and the other half for the other ear, leaving a hole in the center of each ear to put the red pepper slices. Fill each bunny ear with red pepper slices. Put the broccoli at the top of the board between the bunny's ears. Arrange the celery, radish slices, petite carrots, remaining olives and remaining asparagus spears down both sides of the bunny's hummus face plate with the cauliflower at the bottom of the plate. Place two broccoli with a cherry tomato between them on top of the cauliflower bunny's bowtie. Serves 8.

Libraries across the United States will be celebrating **National Library Week April 3-9, 2022**, with the theme, **"Connect With Your Library"**. Did you know there are more public libraries than Starbucks in the United States? There are over 16,000 libraries across the US and almost all provide Wi-Fi and have no-fee access to computers. Your local library, McLean-Mercer Regional Library, has a free public access computer and 2 children's computers as well as free Wi-Fi. (We have coffee too.)

Your local library owns over 34,000 physical items that we share with other libraries in our consortium of public libraries in McLean and Mercer County. McLean-Mercer Regional Library is also part of the ND Library2Go consortium providing access to over 50,000 eBooks, digital audiobooks, and movies. You can even get digital magazines.

Did you know that you can access hundreds of on-line classes through the North Dakota State Library-free? Working on your family genealogy? You can access Ancestry.com free in the library. Looking for something that your local library doesn't have? We can probably borrow that for you from another library in our consortium or through an InterLibrary Loan from the ND State Library.


Our bookmobile travels to 5 schools in McLean and Oliver counties, supplementing the items available in the school libraries. Bookmobile day at the schools is always an exciting day for the students. **National Outreach Day (formerly National Bookmobile Day) is April 6.**

In addition to thousands of books, your local library has large selections of books on CD and movies on DVD. We have the local county newspapers and magazines too. We even have some card & board games. Oh, don't forget the community puzzle! The current puzzle is almost complete. For the kids we have easier puzzles, coloring sheets, LEGOS and more.

Around the exterior of the building, we have painted an obstacle course on the sidewalk. It's not just for kids – anyone can enjoy the course. The course will get some fresh paint later this spring.




What I Want My Kids to Learn When I am Yelling at Them

I yell at my kids more often than I would like to. I am a parent educator and teach ALL of the tools to parents, and still, I find myself yelling.

And while I am often yelling about whining, getting in the car so we can get to school on time, being nice to your sister, and putting toys away, I am not often enough repairing my relationships with my kids.

In my head in a fit of anger, I think my kids would realize by my yelling that whining REALLY bothers me (OK, it completely pushes me over the edge), and that I am serious about planning more the night before, and that by following the perfect routine, we can get out the door exactly at 8:02 a.m. like we need to.

If only my little yell session about how I'm going to "give all of your toys away if you let them lay on the floor one more minute" would really let them know I was serious about the cleanliness of my house.

But they don't realize these things. They are either scared or start to tune me out, which is the normal response at any age when someone you love and trust, and might I say even admire, is yelling at you.

So as a parent educator who has read (too many) articles on parenting strategies and approaches, this is what I want my kids to learn when I am yelling at them.

I want them to know and recognize that I am not dealing with my emotions in a healthy way.

In the parenting world, we call operating with tense emotions what Dan Siegel has named "flipped lid." Here is a little brain anatomy lesson for you. Our pre-frontal cortex houses our ability to empathize, rationalize, make good decisions and have compassion for others, and our amygdala houses our emotions. When we get frustrated, anxious, mad, or furious, our amygdala starts to fire and can no longer talk to our prefrontal cortex. Our negative emotions effect our ability to make good decisions. That is why when we are mad, we sometimes yell.

Ideally, I want my kids to know that any time they are being yelled at, they can immediately recognize that the person in front of them has "flipped their lid." They have the right to create boundaries in a calm matter, and it doesn't help anything to have a yelling match back and forth.

In my house, my kids have the right to say "Mom, you're really upset right now, let's calm down and talk about this," which often sounds like: "Mom stop yelling at us. It isn't nice to yell at us, Mom!"

I want them to know that it is not their fault that I am frustrated and angry, and instead of helping my kids solve the problems that bother me so much, I am letting the emotional part of my brain take over.

I want them to learn from my yelling and apply it to their lives as they grow and may encounter yelling in the workplace, at school, in extracurricular activities or from friends. I want them to realize it is painful to be yelled at, and they may be tempted to blame themselves, but hopefully they can repeat the phrase "Yelling isn't about me. We can talk about ways to solve problems without yelling."

I want them to let me apologize and tell them that while I am super frustrated by their whining, yelling doesn't make anything better.

I don't want to be scary, but sometimes I am.

I know as a parent educator, scaring our kids into behaving has never been shown to have long term success, just short-term, fear compliance that can eventually ruin relationships if the fear is never resolved. I want them to know I don't want to choose scary and yelling mom, but sometimes my brain is firing, and I can't access the positive tools.

When I apologize and attempt to repair the relationship, I want my kids to know I do it because I want them to know that mistakes happen. I do "flip my lid." I am supposed to have it all together and teach parents all these tools, and yet I struggle. I want them to know apologizing is a safe thing to do, a good thing to do.

I want them to be safe in my home and grow into strong, confident women don't respond with fear or avoidance when people yell at them, who are the first to identify that the person in front of them who is mad is actually having a hard time. I want them to grow into people who aren't afraid to admit when they have hurt another person. I want them to learn that saying, "I am sorry" and really meaning it is one of the strongest things you can do.

These are the things I want them to learn from my yelling, but I also want them to learn that you accomplish more when you don't yell. I want them to learn it is super hard to manage emotions and takes a lifetime of learning, but you can start now, and maybe they will notice that sometimes when mom got mad, instead of yelling, she went and read a book for five minutes or quickly stepped outside and breathed in some cold air, and that sometimes she "put her lid back on" before addressing problems.

I also gave up yelling for Lent - which my daughter frequently reminds me. "Now mom, remember, you gave up yelling for Lent, and you're doing it again." Here's to taking a deep breath, putting my lid back on, and repairing those relationships with the little ladies in my life.







2022-24 Fishing Regulations Set

North Dakota's 2022-24 fishing proclamation is set, with regulations effective April 1, 2022, through March 31, 2024. New fishing licenses are required April 1.

Anglers can find the [2022-24 North Dakota Fishing Guide](#) online at the state Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov, or at Game and Fish Department offices and license vendors throughout the state.

Noteworthy regulation changes include:

- Increased the statewide smallmouth/largemouth bass daily limit from 3 to 5 and possession limit from 6 to 10.
- Allow for the taking of walleye during the darkhouse spearfishing season for the Missouri River System, Devils Lake and Stump Lake.
- Paddlefish tags are available for purchase online, and at the Bismarck, Dickinson and Williston Game and Fish offices during normal business hours.

The 2022-23 fishing [licenses can be purchased online](#) by visiting the Game and Fish website.

Report Bald Eagle Nest Sightings

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department is asking for help locating active bald eagle nests.

Conservation biologist Sandra Johnson said the department is looking for locations of nests with eagles present, not individual eagle sightings.

Eagles lay eggs in early to mid-March, which hatch about a month later. Johnson said it's easy to distinguish an eagle nest because of its enormous size.

Nearly 350 active bald eagle nests can be found in 47 of the 53 counties in the state. Historically, Johnson said nests were found along river corridors, but that's not the case today, as bald eagles will nest in trees in the middle of pastures, fields or anywhere a food source is nearby.

[Nest observations should be reported online](#) at the Game and Fish website, gf.nd.gov. Observers are asked not to disturb the nest, and to stay a safe distance away. Johnson said foot traffic may disturb the bird, likely causing the eagle to leave her eggs or young unattended.

Spring Mule Deer Survey Begins

The state Game and Fish Department's annual spring aerial mule deer survey is set to begin around April 1 in western North Dakota. Weather permitting, the survey takes about two weeks to complete.

During the survey period, people could notice low-flying small airplanes over some parts of the badlands.

Game and Fish biologists have completed aerial surveys of the same 24 badlands study areas since the 1950s. The purpose of the survey is to determine a population index to assess mule deer abundance in the badlands.

Open Fires Banned on Oahe WMA, Surrounding Areas

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department is prohibiting open burning this spring on public property it manages south of Bismarck and Mandan, as a means to reduce the potential for wildfires in a heavily wooded recreation area along the Missouri River.

All open burning, including campfires, is banned until further notice on the [Oahe Wildlife Management Area](#) along both sides of the Missouri River. While the use of portable grills is allowed, extreme caution is advised due to the heavily vegetated area.

These woodlands are prone to wildfires prior to spring green-up. Mild temperatures and a high fuel load in the river bottoms are a cause for concern, in addition to being a high-use area for anglers, campers and other outdoor recreationists.

In addition to Oahe WMA, surrounding areas included in the open burn ban include Kimball Bottoms and Maclean Bottoms managed by Bismarck Parks and Recreation District, Desert Off Road Vehicle Area managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and Graner Park managed by Morton County Parks.

Oahe WMA covers more than 16,000 acres along Lake Oahe south of Bismarck-Mandan, in portions of Burleigh, Emmons and Morton counties. Burning restriction signs are posted at all entrances to the WMA.






City Council Meeting
March 14, 2022

The regular Riverdale City Council meeting of March 14, 2022, was called to order at 6:00 PM by President Orth.

Present: Jerry Orth, Garth Zimbelman, Dick Cheatley, Jonna Taylor, and Auditor Del Kolke

Taylor moved to approve the February 14, 2022, meeting minutes. Cheatley seconded. Motion carried.

Taylor moved to approve the bills. Zimbelman seconded. Motion carried.

Taylor moved to approve the agenda. Cheatley seconded. Motion carried.

Guest:

Leon Weisenberger, City of Underwood, expressed concern regarding paying for the raw water line project stating the existing contracts with the partners do not address cost sharing for this portion of infrastructure. Further discussion is warranted.

Old Business:

Taylor moved to purchase thirty (30) 6' poly-covered steel picnic tables for the campground, at a cost of approximately \$819/table, with future notation of damage clause in campground rules to ensure longevity. Zimbelman seconded. Roll Call: Zimbelman aye, Cheatley aye, Taylor aye. Motion carried.

New Business:

City engineer, AJ Tuck, reported the Riverdale raw water supply and gate valve improvements project was approved by the ND Water Commission for 60% cost share reimbursement of engineering, planning and design not to exceed \$225,000. Cheatley moved to accept and execute the cost share agreement. Taylor seconded. Motion carried.

Orth proposed contracting lawn care of city property this season. Details for bid package will be gathered and advertising will follow. Hiring of a part-time employee continues to be an option as well.

Landfill hours for the 2022 season will be every Wednesday 4:00 – 6:00 and the first Saturday of the month from 10:00 – 12:00. Current maintenance employees will man the landfill.

Employee compensation is tabled until April meeting. Auditor is to provide salary and benefit data for council to review.

Reports:

Fire Dept. plans to conduct several control burns this year to contain possible spread of fire during the expected drought conditions this year.

Auditor and maintenance are preparing the backflow prevention cross-contamination control program documents required by the ND Dept. of Environmental Quality. Alternate budget preparations were proposed requiring council members to gather expenditure data with the assistance of employees. City hall will be closed March 18-23 and March 29-30.

Orth reported loader is due for 2000-hour service. Cheatley moved to approve adding Garth Zimbelman to financial accounts, including Bravera Bank and Bank of North Dakota. Taylor seconded. Motion carried.

Cheatley noted modem replacement at the WTF has been completed. All three (3) raw water pumps and motors have been rebuilt/serviced. Additional rebuild kits will be purchased to have on hand for future use.

Next meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 11 at 6:00 PM.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00 PM.
