MEMORIAL DAY

Each year in the United States, Americans observe the Federal holiday, Memorial Day, the last Monday in May. It honors and remembers all men and women who have died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. Memorial Day is also a day to remember all loved ones who have passed away.

#MemorialDay

Traditionally on Memorial Day, the flag of the United States of America is raised briskly to the top of the staff then solemnly lowered to the half-staff position where it remains until noon. At noon, it is then raised to full-staff for the remainder of the day.

When the flag is at half-staff, the position is in remembrance of the more than one million men and women who gave their lives for their country. Raising the flag at noon signifies the nation lives, that the country is resolved not to let their sacrifice be in vain but to rise up in their honor and continue to fight for liberty and justice for all.

In the United States, Memorial Day also traditionally marks the beginning of summer.

HOW TO OBSERVE Memorial Day

Attend Memorial Day services in your community. In your own way, pay tribute in remembrance of service members who have died while serving. Visit a veterans' cemetery to honor those who've impacted your life. Use #MemorialDay to post on social media.

MEMORIAL DAY HISTORY

Honoring the men and women who have died while serving in the military, communities, individuals, and organizations have kept Memorial Day in various forms in the United States since the end of the Civil War. General John Logan first called for a nationwide day of remembrance on May 5, 1868. The observance was called Decoration Day, and it was observed on May 30th, 1868.

Decoration Day

General James Garfield spoke at Arlington National Cemetery with Generals Grant, Howard, Logan, Pane, Wool, and Hancock in attendance. Volunteers also decorated the graves of 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers.

Across the country, humble tributes occurred on that first Decoration Day. Just outside Fort Stevens near Washington, D.C., there was a small cemetery where 40 soldiers were buried, one of whom belonged to a widow from Northern Vermont. He was one of three sons she lost to the war. On Decoration Day, she went to the cemetery carrying 40 wreaths for 40 graves.

Someone placed a laurel wreath upon the head of a Lincoln statue at City Hall, Washington, D.C.

In Cincinnati, Hamilton and Dayton Railroads transported passengers to the Spring Grove Cemetery. As a tribute, communities displayed flags at half-mast along the routes. More volunteers placed floral wreaths on the soldiers' graves, and speeches were made. Many of the first Decoration Days recognized only the Union soldiers. However, other events included the Confederate soldiers as well. Over time, the day grew to include all those soldiers lost during the conflict.

Decoration Day gradually became known as Memorial Day and now honors all U.S. service members who have died during a military conflict. Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30th for many years. Then, in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act of 1968. Since 1971, Memorial Day has been observed the last Monday of May.

A Legend Gone Too Soon

Kevin "Doc" Dockter

Kevin Henry Dockter "Doc", 63, passed away on May 17, 2023 at Sanford Health, Bismarck surrounded by his loving family after a brief but extremely courageous battle with pancreatic cancer. A Celebration of Life will be held at Riverdale High Lodge at 10:30 am on May 27, 2023, with a prayer service held on Friday May 26th, at 6:30 pm at Riverdale High Lodge. Burial service will be held on Monday, May 29th at 11:00 am at St. Andrews Lutheran Cemetery, rural Zeeland, ND where he was baptized and confirmed.

Kevin, son of Alfred and Elaine (Deile) Dockter, was born December 12th, 1959 at the Linton Hospital. He was the third of six siblings, who grew up on the family farm along Beaver Creek in rural Zeeland, ND. Alfred and Elaine were loving parents who gave him his incredible set of values, work ethic, and genuine love for people. Kevin's sister and four brothers were truly his lifelong best friends, and growing up on the farm together taught them how to both work and play hard as a family.

He attended school in Zeeland, where his love of sports began. He excelled in all sports, but football was his true passion. As the Captain of his football team, he helped lead the Zeeland Vikings to a State Football Championship in 1977.

Kevin attended Valley City State University and graduated with a Bachelor's of Science Degree in Education. He received a football scholarship, and played for all four years. The VCSU Vikings Football team were the NDCAC Champions for three consecutive years. He established many friendships here that lasted a lifetime.

Kevin married his high school sweetheart, Julie Bollinger, on August 14th, 1982. They then moved to Riverdale, ND, where Kevin was hired for a teaching position and also started his coaching career. They fell in love with Riverdale and never left. Here, he became a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Kevin and Julie welcomed two daughters, Megan and Brittany. Kevin was the most incredible husband and dad to his "girls." He was never afraid to tell them how much he loved them, he taught them everything about life, how to treat people, and how to live life to the fullest. He filled their days with trips to the lake, learning to play sports, attending football games, bringing them to his childhood home at the farm, and family ski trips. His family was truly the most important thing in his life.

Kevin's teaching and coaching career spanned over 35 years. In Riverdale, he taught 5th grade, and then when Riverdale school closed in 1992 he continued teaching in Underwood, where he remained teaching and coaching until his retirement. He coached a variety of sports, including basketball, golf, track, and most importantly football. As a teacher, he had a unique ability to connect with any student. He took a genuine interest in his students and cared so deeply for so many. He was a positive influence and mentor to countless youth. As a football coach, Doc was competitive and successful. His athletes were extremely important to him. He considered so many of them to be like family, and stayed connected to them far beyond their high school years. His memories with his players were some of the highlights of his life, and stories he shared often. He also had incredible friendships with his fellow coaches, both in Underwood and throughout the state of North Dakota. In 2021, the football field in Underwood was officially dedicated to him, and will forever remain "Kevin Dockter Field."

Kevin enjoyed many hobbies throughout his life. He loved living by Lake Sakakawea, and spent many days on the lake with family and friends. He enjoyed hunting, especially with his brothers, nephews, son-in-law, and with his dogs Gracie and Mia. Snow skiing was another favorite activity, and he made sure to take at least one ski trip every year. He attended and watched many sporting events, especially football games all over the state. He was also an avid NDSU Bison Football fan, and enjoyed tailgating at "The Dockter's Office" and traveling to Frisco with his brothers to attend the National Championship football games. There were also many trips back to his family farm for hunting, trail rides, fixing fence, and making hay. He loved being outdoors and took daily walks out on the country roads up until the last days of his life.

Kevin was a proud and beloved Papa to his 5 grandchildren, Theo (8), Lillian (5), Watson (4), Nora (2), and Oliver (1). He was so looking forward to meeting his future grandchild, a baby boy who is due in October of this year. Papa and Mimi made many trips to Bismarck and Herreid to help take care of their grandkids. He planned special outings, played football and basketball, read stories, took them to the lake, the gym, the football field, and loved to spoil them with special treats and gifts. Out of all of his many accomplishments in life, he considered his family to be the greatest one.



On May 14, 2023 the mountain Snow Water Equivalent (SWE) in the "Total above Fort Peck" reach is 11.2" and 60% of the annual peak remains. The mountain SWE in the "Fort Peck to Garrison" reach is 9.2" and 58% of the annual peak remains. The normal peak for both reaches occurs near April 17. The "Total above Fort Peck" reach peaked on April 24 at 18.6" SWE and 117% of the normal peak. The "Fort Peck to Garrison" reach peaked on April 6 at 15.9" SWE and 109% of the normal peak.

*Minimum peak SWE between 1991-2020 occurred in 2015 above Fort Peck, and in 2001 between Fort Peck and Garrison. Maximum peak SWE between 1991-2020 occurred in 2011 above Fort Peck, and in 1997 between Fort Peck and Garrison.



SAFETY TIPS THAT ARE ALWAYS IN SEASON

- 1. Know what's below. CALL 811 before starting any digging project.
- 2. Always USE A SPOTTER to warn you of any dangers when moving equipment.
- 3. If you strike a guy wire, NEVER REPAIR IT YOURSELF. Call your local utility right away.
- 4. WATER CONDUCTS ELECTRICITY, so be careful when irrigating near power lines.
- Keep yourself and machinery AT LEAST 10 FEET AWAY from overhead power lines.
- 6. Be extra careful when operating sprayers, planters and cultivators. KNOW THE HEIGHT AND WIDTH OF YOUR FARM EQUIPMENT to prevent accidental contact.

WHAT TO DO

If a power line falls across or near your machinery while you are in it, stay inside and **CALL 911**. Tell bystanders to stay away. If you must exit, jump as far as possible, so no part of your body is touching the machinery when you land. **KEEP BOTH FEET TOGETHER** and shuffle or hop at least 40 feet away.

NORTH DAKOTA GAME & FISH May Highlights Safe Boating

A week-long <u>national safe boating public awareness campaign</u> is May 20-26, an annual event that serves to educate boaters and water users heading into summer.

A boat should have enough U.S. Coast Guard approved life jackets on board for all passengers. North Dakota law requires all children ages 10 and younger to wear a personal flotation device while in boats of less than 27 feet in length. The law also requires all personal watercraft users to wear a life jacket, as well as anyone towed on skis, tubes, boards or other similar devices. However, state law allows an individual who is at least 16 years of age to windsurf or boardsail without wearing a PFD.

In addition, effective Aug. 1, a new state law will allow an individual engaged in barefoot skiing or surfing to wear a wet suit. A life preserver must be on board the towing vessel.

Water users should make sure to wear life jackets that are the appropriate size and in good condition. Failure to wear a personal flotation device is the main reason people lose their lives in water recreation accidents.

Water skiers and tubers should wear a life jacket with four nylon straps rather than one with a zipper, because straps are stronger than zippers upon impact with water. Anglers and people paddling a canoe, kayak or paddleboard should opt for a PFD that is comfortable enough to wear for an entire outing.

It is also important that children wear a PFD while swimming. Swimmers should know the water's depth, as serious injuries can occur from diving. Large objects hidden below the water's surface can lead to significant injury.

North Dakota boaters are also reminded that marine VHF radios are an important part of boat safety that should not be improperly used by operators. These radios are intended for boat operators in distress and facing an emergency situation.

Leave Baby Animals Alone, Watch for Deer

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department offers a simple message to the well-intentioned who want to pick up and rescue what appear to be orphaned baby animals this time of year: don't touch them. Whether it is a young fawn, duckling, cottontail rabbit or a songbird, it is better to leave them alone.

Often, young animals are not abandoned or deserted, and the mother is probably nearby. Young wildlife are purposely secluded by adults to protect them from predators.

Anytime a young wild animal has human contact, its chance of survival decreases significantly. It's illegal to take wild animals home, and captive animals later returned to the wild will struggle to survive without possessing learned survival skills.

The only time a baby animal should be picked up is if it is in an unnatural situation, such as a young songbird found on a doorstep. In that case, the young bird can be moved to the closest suitable habitat.

Citizens should also steer clear of adult wildlife, such as deer or moose that might wander into urban areas. Crowding stresses animals and can lead to a potentially dangerous situation.

In addition, motorists are reminded to watch for deer along roadways. During the next several weeks young animals are dispersing from home ranges, and with deer more active during this time, the potential for car-deer collisions increases.

Camping Restriction Lifted for Memorial Day

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department will lift the <u>Tuesday-Wednesday no-camping restriction</u> for Memorial Day week, which will allow overnight camping May 30-31 on those WMAs that otherwise have this two-day restriction in place.


