

MAY HOLIDAYS AND HISTORY

May is the fifth month of the year in the Gregorian and its predecessor, the Julian calendar. Named after the Greek goddess, Maia who is also identified Bona Dea (the Roman goddess of fertility), May is the time of spring in the Northern Hemisphere. In the Southern Hemisphere, May is a season of Autumn.

Originally the third month of the year, May later moved to the fifth month when January and February were added to the calendar. It contains 31 days.

The fifth month is also the last month of Spring. Some Native American tribes called the May full moon The Full Flower Moon, The Corn Planting Moon or the Milk Moon.

May is also full of myths and superstitions, like these:

•To maintain a youthful appearance and enhance your beauty, wash your face in the dew you collect on the morning of the first of May.

•Marry in May, you'll rue the day. It is considered very bad luck to get married in May; perhaps because it is considered by some to be the wedding month of the God and Goddess and it would be very rude to upstage them.

•Wash a blanket in May, you'll wash a dear one away. It is bad luck to wash your blankets in May or to buy a new broom.

•According to one superstition, children born this month will be sickly all their lives and cats born this month won't catch mice, but might bring snakes into the house.

Good weather in May is not necessarily a good thing.

A wet May brings a big load of hay.

A cold May is kindly and fills the barn finely.

Mist in May and heat in June makes harvest come right soon.


3. The Anglo Saxon word for May was "Tri-Milchi" meaning 3 milks because the grass had become so lush and green that you could milk the cows three times a day!

4. In 1644, England banned Maypoles. These are poles usually made of wood and long enough to stand as a celebration prop for European festivals. Maypole dances are held in May, usually on May Day. However, some European countries celebrate May Day in mid-summer as well. Even after such restriction, people used to put up maypoles to celebrate their May festivals. One such maypole, which was 123 feet long, was put up in London; this was done to observe Charles II's return. However, this maypole was later used by Isaac Newton to support his telescope.





- 1. Know what's below. CALL 811 before starting any digging project.
- 2. Always USE A SPOTTER to warn you of any dangers when moving equipment.
- 3. If you strike a guy wire, NEVER REPAIR IT YOURSELF. Call your local utility right away.
- 4. W so be careful when irrigating near power lines.
- 5. Keep yourself and machinery from overhead power lines.
- 6. Be extra careful when operating sprayers, planters and cultivators. NT to prevent accidental contact.

IF YOU CONTACT A POWER LINE:

If a power line falls across or near your machinery while you are in it, stay Inside and CALL 911. Tell bystanders to stay away. If you must exit, jump as far as possible, so no part of your body is touching the machinery when you land. KEEP BOTH FEET TOGETHER and shuffle or hop at least 40 feet away.

Mule Deer Survey Completed

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department completed its annual mule deer survey, and results indicate western North Dakota's mule deer population is 29% lower than last year and 5% below the long-term average.

Biologists counted 1,994 mule deer in 286.3 square miles during this year's survey. The overall mule deer density in the badlands was 7.0 deer per square mile.

Big game management supervisor Bruce Stillings said declines are due to effects from extreme winter conditions this year and historic blizzards from the previous spring that produced approximately 40 inches of snow with high winds and low temperatures.

Biologists had concerns with mule deer numbers heading into this winter based on results from the fall survey. The fall survey is conducted to assess demographics of mule deer in the badlands. Buck:doe ratio and fawn production expressed as fawn:doe ratio are determined to evaluate population status and productivity of mule deer.

Biologists counted 1,116 mule deer in the aerial survey in October, which was 31% lower than in 2021. The ratio of 69 fawns per 100 does was higher than 2021 (60/100) but well below the long-term average (87/100), while 40 bucks per 100 does was similar to 2021 (38/100) and the long-term (43/100).

The spring mule deer survey is used to assess mule deer abundance in the badlands. It is conducted after snow melt and before trees begin to leaf out, providing the best conditions for aerial observation of deer. Biologists have completed aerial surveys of the same 24 study areas since the 1950s.

The fall aerial survey, conducted specifically to study demographics, covers 24 study areas and 306.3 square miles in western North Dakota. Biologists also survey the same study areas in spring of each year to determine deer abundance.

Earth Day, Every Day

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department encourages students to design Earth Day patches to bring greater awareness to the environment in the state and elsewhere.

Yet, like Earth Day, which began in 1970 and kicked-started the environmental movement, the concern for our outdoor places isn't simply a once-a-year-thing, but ongoing.

Understanding this, the Game and Fish Department supports Earth Day, Every Day to promote continual awareness about the environment.

Anyone who participates in public land clean up and improvement projects will receive the 2023 Earth Day Patch to recognize their service and celebrate Earth Day. Projects that qualify include refuse removal on local, state or federal property, and landscaping on public property such as planting trees, bushes and pollinator plants.


