Who you help, who you talk to, what you do, what you keep and give, etc.

This story has been the guiding hand of our lives and business. The Dash for us started in a grocery bag full of extra baby items set aside for anyone who might need them. Eventually the grocery bag evolved into a tote, and the tote into the back of minivan, minivan into a spare bedroom and the spare bedroom grew into a loft. Finally, the loft space grew into what is now The Dash's store front on main street in Hazen. Our mission started with new family's struggling to provide for their families and has grown into a business that provides for people from all walks of life.

Our store is run solely by our families, volunteers and their families. Volunteers choose their day to work, and benefit from many perks from first pick of items, to seeing people they rarely get a chance to catch up with.

We are open three days a week and each day sees a different group of hardworking people. Our most volunteer rich day is decidedly Thursday when you'll see anywhere from three to ten people working hard to make The Dash a one-of-akind thrifting experience. Several of our volunteers have small children who they bring with them each week, finding a way to make The Dash a kid friendly and welcoming environment to every kid who comes in our door. They spend their days learning how to socialize with adults, counting change and making friends who recognize them wherever they go, building them a lifelong community to lean on.

In addition to working closely with the children and young adults of our community, we have also worked hard to foster excellent relationships with the retirement community. We have volunteers from assisted living, and women looking to get out of the house after their 9-5 days are over. We also spend a great deal of our days helping people shop for the perfect gift, a mother-in-law's dress for a wedding, or a suit to bury the great love of their life in. We take great pride in making sure no one goes underserved in our community. There is rarely a day that goes by where we don't send someone out of The Dash without paying, whether they are short on cash, it's their birthday, or they just needed a little pick me up. It is our great honor and pleasure to bring a small joy to their day, week, month, or even year.

On the 5-year anniversary of our doors opening for the first time, we will be hosting a Touch A Truck and Food Drive, complete with food, face painting, music, cotton candy, and local vendors and business pop-ups. With the help of countless local businesses and individuals, we have been able to plan this mostly free event for our customers and their families as our way to say thank you and give back to a world that has given us so much.

While it is a celebration of our 5-year anniversary, our MAIN focus of the day is the Food Drive. Our goal is to donate at least 2,000 pounds of food to the Youth**Works** organization, benefitting homeless and at-risk youth in the state of ND. Along with filling the Youth**Works** pantry, we also hope to back stock their personal hygiene items and necessities. We have received an incredible response from the community and the donations to our drive have already been overwhelming. The community is showing up in a huge way for us and we couldn't be more chuffed to be from such an amazing place.

While Bishop Zipfel's story was short, we have expanded upon it day in and day out, taking it from a short story to the novel it is today. The Dash will hopefully change the way people see the world, as I know it has changed the way we do.

July History and Holidays

National Day Calendar

The seventh month of the Gregorian year is named in honor of Julius Caesar. In 63 B.C. Caesar had been elected Pontifex Maximus. The calendar was 355 days long and gradually through mishandling and corruption (pontiffs allowing the calendar to lengthen to please one priest, shortening it to anger another) January slipped into fall.

Quintilis

July was originally named *Quintilis* after Marcus Aurelius Claudius Quintillus, a Roman Emperor who died in 270 B.C. While <u>Caesar</u> didn't place the month of *Quintilis* (meaning fifth) in the strangely seventh place, he did decide to change from a lunisolar to a solar calendar. (Before the Roman calendar, there were only ten months, and *Quintilis* was the fifth month. When the Romans added new months, *Quintilis* and other months were adjusted.) The solar year would consist of 365 days, adding 10 to the total. The extra days were distributed among the months with 29 days.

Julius Caesar

A year after Caesar completed the calendar, he was assassinated on the Ides of March. In his honor, the Roman Senate named the seventh month July, the month of Caesar's birth.

The new calendar went into effect on the first day of January 709 A.U.C. (*ab urbe condita*—"from the founding of the city [Rome]") January 1, 45 B.C. and put an end to the arbitrary and inaccurate nature of the early Roman system. The Julian calendar became the predominant calendar throughout Europe for the next 1600 years until Pope Gregory made further reforms in 1582.

Certain countries and institutions in fact adhered to this ancient system until well into the twentieth century: the Julian calendar was used in Russia until 1917 and in China until 1949, and to this day the Eastern Orthodox church adheres to Caesar's calendar.

Weather & Seasons

July weather in the Northern Hemisphere begins heating up. The dog days of summer begin in July and carry through until August. In the Southern Hemisphere, it is the second month of winter. The July weather is an excellent time for completing home renovations and projects. This summer month is also perfect for eating ice cream. In fact, the entire month celebrates ice cream and there are seven, yes seven, ice cream-related holidays on the calendar to keep us cool.

In the Southern Hemisphere, July is the second month of winter. While July's average temperatures make it the hottest month of the year in the Northern Hemisphere, July is also the coldest month on average in the Southern Hemisphere.

July's full moon is called the Buck Moon because a male deer's antlers grow the fastest and reach its annual growth potential in July.

What's Your Sign?

NORTH DAKOTA GAME & FISH

Anglers Should Keep Fish Caught in Deep Water

North Dakota Game and Fish Department fisheries personnel encourage anglers to keep fish caught from depths of more than 25 feet, rather than practice catch-and-release.

Scott Gangl, Game and Fish fisheries management section leader, said with the exceptional fish bite at Lake Sakakawea this summer, anglers should know fish reeled in from this depth will likely die if released.

"As water warms during summer, fish tend to move to deeper, cooler water," Gangl said. "This is particularly true for walleye in the big lake, where they follow their primary forage of rainbow smelt to deeper depths as summer progresses. Now fish are being caught at depths where barotrauma is a concern."

Change in water pressure will cause the swim bladder to expand, Gangl said, which means fish can no longer control balance. In addition, he said other internal injuries are likely, such as ruptured blood vessels or damaged internal organs. Because of these other internal injuries, biologists discourage fizzing, the practice of deflating the swim bladder.

<u>Barotrauma can happen</u> in any deep water body such as Devils Lake, Lake Oahe and Lake Sakakawea, Gangl said, but it is especially noteworthy for this time of year in the big lake.

Prior to fishing at least 25 feet deep, anglers should make the decision to keep what they catch.

Say Yes to Clean, Drain, Dry

While the effort to stop the introduction and transportation of aquatic nuisance species in North Dakota has been mostly successful, challenges remain as not all anglers, pleasure boaters and other water enthusiasts are abiding by the clean, drain, dry message.

For example, last week department game wardens and other department staff inspected over 1,200 watercrafts throughout the state. Unfortunately, these inspections found four watercraft that were transporting zebra mussels. Luckily, in all four incidences, the zebra mussels were determined to be dead.

North Dakota waters remain relatively free of aquatic nuisance species. Besides common carp, most species – zebra mussels, Eurasian water milfoil, flowering rush, curly-leaf pondweed and three species of invasive carp – are only found in a handful of waters in the state.

To keep our waters clean of aquatic nuisance species, the Game and Fish Department reminds all anglers, pleasure boaters and water users to clean, drain and dry all equipment after every use.

Clean and remove all plants and animals from watercraft or equipment prior to leaving any recreational area.
Drain all water from watercraft and equipment before leaving designated access points. Not draining water can be extremely hazardous and may cause negligent transportation of aquatic nuisance species to other locations.
Dry all equipment completely before using again.

Guide and Outfitter Exam Scheduled

The next guide and outfitter written examination is Aug. 19 at 1 p.m. at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department office in Bismarck. Preregistration is required no later than Aug. 11 by calling the Department's enforcement office at 701-328-6604.

The test is given periodically to anyone interested in becoming a guide or outfitter in the state.

In addition to passing a written exam, qualifications for becoming a hunting guide include a background check for criminal and game and fish violations, certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and standard first aid, and employment by or contract with a licensed hunting outfitter.

Hunting outfitter eligibility requirements include the guide qualifications, as well as an individual must have held a hunting guide license for two years and must have proof of liability insurance.

INGREDIENTS

Shredded Cheeses 6 oz. cheddar cheese 6 oz. Monterey jack cheese 6 oz. gouda cheese

<u>Cheese Sauce</u> 1/2 stick butter 16 oz. Velveeta 2 c. milk

Finishing Touches 1 c. milk 1 tbsp. BBQ rub



Macaroni Noodles

- 8 c. water
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 lb. box macaroni noodles

Seasonings 2 c. grated Parmesan cheese 1 tsp. granulated garlic 1 tsp. black pepper 1 c. milk

DIRECTIONS

Preheat your smoker to 350-375 degrees with wood oak. Shred all of the cheeses and mix them together in a large bowl. You should end up with about 6 cups. Bring the water and salt to a boil in a large pot. Add the pasta and cook for 7-8 minutes. Pour into a colander and rinse with cold water. Set aside. In a large pot over medium heat, melt together the butter, Velveeta, 3 cups of shredded cheese mix and 2 cups milk. Stir until smooth. Place the noodles in an aluminum half pan. Mix in the Parmesan cheese, granulated garlic, black pepper, 1 ½ cups of the shredded cheese and 1 cup milk. Pour the cheese sauce into the pan and stir well. Top with 1 ½ cups shredded cheese. Pour 1 cup milk over the top. Sprinkle on your favorite BBQ rub. Place the pan on the smoker over indirect heat. Smoke for 30 minutes until brown and bubbly. Serves 12




