


WEATHER PROVERBS FROM 2022 FOLKLORE & FUN FACTS NOVEMBER

Dear City Residents, PICKCity.

We are pleased to announce that the city council has made the decision to renew the garbage contract with Circle Sanitation. With the renewal of the contract, we will be switching to full automation service, with full automation only garbage that is in the totes can be taken at the curb. This will also require us to switch out any of the smaller totes to the bigger totes. If you need or wish to get an additional tote you can contact the city office to request an additional tote for a small fee. Circle Sanitation will be switching out any small totes, as well as delivering additional totes to residents that have requested them on <u>December 14th, 2022</u>. The first day of tote only will be <u>Wednesday, January 4th, 2023</u>. Below are some guidelines to keep in mind:

- Only totes provided by Circle Sanitation will be dumped.
- <u>ONLY</u> the trash in the tote will be taken each week. Please continue to bag your household trash before placing inside the residential tote. Any trash next to tote will not be taken. Additional totes can be provided for a small charge by contacting the city auditor.
- Only household garbage is allowed in the totes. Small amounts of compost (grass clippings, leaves, and garden waste) are allowed in the tote but needs to be bagged. Hazardous waste or ashes are NOT allowed in the tote.
- Larger items such as carpet, furniture, or mattresses can be picked up with the rear load truck for an additional fee by calling Circle Sanitation to set up a special pickup.
- Please have the <u>tote out by 7:00AM</u> on garbage day with the handle of the tote facing in, away from street and clear of cars, mailboxes, and other obstructions. Please keep the tote clear of snow. Do not place tote on top of snow banks. Totes should be at least 5 feet away from cars, poles, fences, and other totes.
- Please place the tote curbside or equivalent. Totes cannot be placed in can racks or holders of any kind.
- To help maintain the appearance of your neighborhood please remove the tote from the curb as soon as possible. The tote is intended to be stored in your garage or other convenient location next to your home.
- Please do not overload the tote in excess of your ability to safely maneuver it. Please try to keep the lid closed to keep pets and rodents from entering tote.
- If tote is blocked (cars, trees, mailboxes, etc.), tote <u>WILL NOT</u> be dumped until the next regular service day. Any garbage set next to the tote will not be picked up.
- Circle Sanitation will maintain ownership of the totes. If they are lost or negligently damaged, it will be the responsibility of the resident to pay to replace it. Do not deface tote in anyway.
- If you are moving from your residence please leave at residence for new owners or contact Circle Sanitation so that we may collect the tote.
