Water Report: March analysis satisfactory

- Bids were received for updating water plant. Mayor signed contract with Circle Controls & Engineer will contact W.W. Goetsch to order parts
- Anderson will go to the O & M Training at Beulah on April 12th.

Distribution checks: Highway - \$453.31; Rest & Lodging - \$128.20; C. Conversion - \$1413.46; C. Severance - \$2140.01; Revenue Sharing - \$746.54

Old & New Business:

- Don Wald had questions on annexing property which he is purchasing from Les Bornemann. The part that would be annex to the City is a 240' x 150" lot with no street in that section of property. Council wants to review his request when the full council is present. He would need to get a survey & also contact a lawyer to handle annexation process. Will contact maintenance man regarding locations of water & sewer lines.
- Westman motioned, Anderson second, to have the city pay half the cost (\$385.00) of AED battery that is located in main hall. Fire Dept. will pay other half. Motion carried.
- Anderson filled out a nominating petition for Mayor. He suggested that the City still advertise for more people to run for office.
- Westman had some cost figures for asphalt for SW Addition streets \$22.50 per ton + \$7.20 per ton for trucking. Council agreed that the city should get more bids.
- Runoff management as it applies to building permits were discussed. Zoning would have to handle the matter.
- Lori Davis & Auditor put in for the Vibrancy Grant for flowers beds & weed management on Main Street.
- Westman motioned, Anderson second, to approve building permit for TJ Hanna. All in favor.
- Anderson motioned, Westman second, to approve Scott Hobbs building permit. All in favor.
- Board of Equalization meeting will be held April 14th at 7:45pm at City Hall.
- Westman motioned, Anderson second, to approve the gaming site authorization for American Legion Post #91 at the Dam Bar. All in favor.
- Anderson motioned, Westman second, to approve the Pledge of Securities from USB in the amount of \$600,000.00, all in favor.
- Anderson motioned, Westman second to approve building permit for Seth Sandness. All in favor.
- Auditor will get bids for painting city hall.
- With no further business meeting adjourned to BOE meeting on April 14th. Next regular meeting May 2, 2022.
